World Book Day




World Book Day is **Thursday 7th March.** We would like to invite all the children to come to school dressed as their favourite character from a book.

be sent out today. Please complete the slip confirming your attendance and return to the office by ${f Friday}\ {f 8}^{th}\ {f February}.$


WOW! Sheets

Chinese New Year






Tuesday 5th February and throughout the week. Don't forget children can come to school wearing red tomorrow, Tuesday. We have some exciting related activities for the children to participate in.

Class Information

Elementary

Last week children have been exploring Kenning poetry which use metaphors, as well as Haikus, and other poems that use metaphors.

Children have been working in pairs and writing some beautiful poems as a team. Other literacy activities

last week included writing mechanics, using capital letters for proper nous and use of the correct punctuation. We also have been working on book reviews, which help children with their independent reading comprehension skills. Children are also reading about fish and mammals and completing reports to share, as well as learning, reading writing and researching about the Andes mountains. In maths children have been working on subtraction with change, long division, money work and multiplication skills.

Prep

Last week the children were introduced to Prefix. We looked at how adding a word such as 'un' or 're' could modify the word and make the term negative. We also looked at advertisements in Newspapers and some of the children had a go at creating an advert for a Spaceship.

In Maths, some of the children were introduced to simple addition and subtraction using the Stamp Game while others were introduced to Dynamic Subtraction and Division. We also had some children repeating their work with the multiplication and division board or challenging themselves with the box of Addition or Multiplication Equations. We continued our topic of graphs but this time focusing on Pictograms. The children used their knowledge of counting in 2s, 4s and 5s to help them answer questions relating to the graph.

During our topic session, we discussed and learnt some interesting facts about Planet Mercury and have begun to create a fact file on planets.

Reception

Last week we had a practical maths lesson, because we learned about "Capacity". We poured water into 3 different glasses of water and we labelled the empty one, the one that was half full and full. Then we named and wrote that in our maths books.

We began to study words that contain – oo,ee,ea, ou, and we wrote sentences with them.

We had a very exciting Design and Technology session with Miss Alex. We made various moving animals in the jungle and the Savanna.

Zoe brought in the book 'Spot 50 garden birds' to school and we looked at it with great interest. We read a lot of interesting facts about the birds we saw last week in Lloyd Park.

This week we will be celebrating the Chinese New Year. Zoe sang a lovely melodic song for us and told us how her mum bakes traditional biscuits for this holiday.

During our Art lesson on Friday we designed a Dragon to participate in Chinese New Year celebrations.

Kindergarten:

Beech:

Last week Beech class continued talking about the continent Asia. We looked at Japan, where we learned some Japanese words, located the capital city Tokyo, on the map, as well as further increasing our knowledge we looked at the flag. Furthermore, we talked about India. Children enjoyed listening to Indian music and dancing with the teacher who was dressed in a sari. One of children, Safia brought in her Pakistani traditional Salwar kameez outfit in the classroom and showed to her friends! We also talked about Cambodia and Thailand, their traditional food, music, flags, and capital cities.

This week we will start to learn about Antarctica.

Oak:

Last week we looked at amazing far away countries called Japan, India, Cambodia and Thailand. We learned about Japanese culture and the Japanese flag, we also practised saying few words in Japanese as well as picking small objects using chopsticks.

During our lessons about India we learned about its location, climate, food and people. We discussed schools in India and compared them to schools in England. We tried on some traditional Indian clothes, smelt Indian spices such as cinnamon and aniseed and looked at pictures of traditional Indian



food. We also watched a small clip about Taj Mahal, learned about its history and coloured in our own Taj Mahal drawings. On Thailand and Cambodia days, we talked about these countries' traditional clothes, food, people and national languages.



During our PE session we practised kicking ball while going around cones in the garden. During our Music lesson we listened to flamenco music and danced with castanets.

Sycamore:

Last week the children have been learning interesting facts about India. We

learning by providing the children

with various spices to smell and name. Smelling bottles are commonly found in the sensorial area of the classroom. The typical presentation involves

giving children the opportunity to use their sense of smell in many different forms. We decorated the Indian flag using tissue paper.

Classical Indian music was played, and the children were shown simple forms of precision, movement, gestures, steps, and poses.

The children felt the fabric of a teachers 'Saree' as well as looking at the pretty 'bindi' many women wear.

On Friday we looked at the beautiful country of Thailand and all of the attractive costumes that are worn as well as exploring the different dishes that are eaten on a daily basis. For art the children decorated an elephant picture as elephants are portrayed as **sacred** animals.


This week, we will move onto a new continent, 'Antarctica and how this continent mainly stays cold. We will have many activities associated with Antarctica, such as melting in different forms. What extra warm clothing is worn? Also asking the children if they were to visit Antarctica what would they take on their voyage. The children will participate in a penguin art activity using a paper plate. For 'Chinese New' year the children will engage in lots of activities to further their knowledge regarding this very special tradition that is celebrated worldwide.

Nursery:

Last week, the nursery children were introduced to traditional dances around the world. We started the

week by listening and dancing to Flamenco music followed by an art activity of creating a flamenco dancer.

Then the children were introduced to Irish step dancing with a live performance by Miss

about the traditional Russian Kalinka dance through a video presentation. By the end of the week they chose a partner to dance Tango with followed by a painting activity where the children painted two tango dancers.

Our 'out and about session' brought a lot of excitement when we did a scavenger hunt, trying to find various items in the garden (a leaf, a stone, twig, something heavy, something light, something green). This week, we will be celebrating Chinese New Year through variety of presentations, discussions and art activities. We will be creating lanterns, red envelopes and a dragon collage.

Please help your children by finding fun ways together to identify topic of the week at home, to support their work in school.
