This is a polite reminder that if you are driving to school and dropping off your children, to drive slowly and carefully when parking near the school.




#### Fire Drill

# **Class Information**

#### **Elementary**

Welcome back everyone after a restful and enjoyable half term! Elementary class has been very busy before the half-term holiday. Specifically, we focused on our film production topic, mainly writing and finishing the script, designing our fictional characters and creating our storyboard. Children are working hard on this as we need to finish their movie soon. In Art students practiced the creation of movement through frames, acquiring as a result a better understanding of how movement is perceived by our eyes. They also worked hard on the art project and helped Reception class with the preparation of their Cafe project. In Literacy students practiced writing mechanics, conjunctions and commas, and practiced reading various texts on different topics. Working with the Fractions' materials was the main topic of the week in Maths specifically equivalent fractions and addition and subtraction, along with Geometry. were students practiced calculating the area and perimeter of a shape by using live examples, such as their classroom. For PE students continued practicing eye-ball coordination in tennis and also using the racket from both sides to hit the ball, while in PSHE children talked about the limits of tolerance for different people, and when one is good to stop their annoying behaviour towards someone.

#### Reception and Prep

The children learned about different aspects of food hygiene. They learned about personal hygiene what they should do before and after cooking. Children looked at food storage, where we should store foods, we also looked into the difference storage methods needed if the food is cooked or un-cooked.

Children spent time creating their pictures for the art project. We look forward to seeing them in the completed design and show cased for all to view.

All the children finished off their crafts to be sold at the cafe. Whilst doing this children had the opportunity to use the laminator machine, learning about how it works and about various

ways we could use it.



In preparation for our cafe our budding chefs prepared food and used various electrical appliances to aid this. All the children were able to watch the smoothies

being made and enjoyed watching the popcorn machine in action!



What a lovely way to end the half term with Rainbow Cafe! We worked hard together as a team to set and to run our

cafe/shop. Tremendous effort and great enthusiasm from all the children involved, we are very proud of you all! You impressed us in lots of ways and you all did an amazing job in making our cafe a success. Thank you to everyone who visited our cafe we hope you enjoyed it!

#### **Kindergarten:**

#### Beech:

During the last week of the half term Beech class prepared everything for their cafe. We finished the logo for the cafe and made rainbow decorations out of paper plates. We reinforced our knowledge of money and table manners in a group activity. The children made homemade lemonade by squeezing the lemons and mixing the



juice with water and sugar. They were really excited and proud of their product. It was lovely to see them getting orders from the parents and serving them.

This term we will be talking about people who wear uniforms as part of their jobs.

#### **Sycamore:**

Sycamore class enjoyed a fun filled week working on our WMS cafe. The children enjoyed using their creative skills to decorate the cafe including making a beautiful sign.

We have all learnt a lot about 'Enterprise' this term including healthy eating, business hierarchy and

activities all about money. Our grand opening of the cafe went down a treat as we welcomed our lovely parents to share some delightful treats with us.



With the lovely weather upon us, we took the opportunity to participate in some lovely presentations using our Montessori materials outside. The children demonstrated their concentration skills as most were able to grade the long rods activity. The children familiarised themselves with language such as long, longest, shorter to visually discriminate between each of the 10 rectangular prisms.

We also played the talking stick game to enable the development of communication and language skills specifically in a group. Each child held the stick and shared one interesting fact with their teachers and peers before passing it on to the next child.

This week, we have lots of exciting activities planned around our topic people in uniform.

#### Oak:

Oak class was very busy during the last week before our half term break! Monday we spent adding finishing touches to the designs we made to decorate our very own Rainbow Café. In the process we discussed what materials are and what materials can be used for what purposes. On Tuesday we had a lesson about leaflets. We looked at different types of leaflets and discussed what information they can carry and how businesses/organisations can use them. On Wednesday we tried a new way of creating colourful pictures -

bubble painting. We used dish soap, paint and straws to create colourful bubbles which we then captured on paper. This was not easy, but we are definitely doing that again! On Thursday we were busy baking blueberry muffins for our café. We measured, weighed, counted, stirred and poured ingredients to make vegan muffins by the recipe we



found on Internet. This was good fun! And finally, on Friday it was the grand opening of our café, where we role played working as bakers and shop assistants. We sold delicious food that was prepared by us and our friends from other classes, it was a great experience! Thank you so much for the parents that attended and supported.

#### **Nursery**

The week, before the half term, the nursery children were learning about bees and the pollination process through picture presentation and arts and crafts. We were identifying parts of the

flower and the body parts of the bee. Further on, we explored the growing process of a plant through dance movements to the action song: "I'm a little seed"



and followed the adventures of the tiny seed in the book by Eric Carle.

This week we are going to talk about the food we eat and different food groups. We are going to focus on healthy eating and comparing healthy and unhealthy food. We are going to discuss how our body reacts to healthy and unhealthy food and the importance of a balanced food diet. The children will also have an opportunity to listen to and discuss about the story "The little red hen".
