Reception

Last week we started looking at various number problems and problems including money. We also worked on creating sentences along with using capital letter and full stop.

Reception class really enjoyed our Thanksgiving dinner and activities. Children learnt about the history of Thanksgiving and about how people



celebrate Thanksgiving today. Children also spent time sharing with the class what they were thankful for. It was lovely to see the children enjoying their dinner and for lots of them trying pumpkin pie for the first time, which

Last week Beech class

were very busy learning how to look after our environment, oceans and forests and the importance of recycling so as to help planet Earth "stay healthy". The children have shared their thoughts about it, and they realised that one of the best ways to help planet Earth is by recycling at home.

The children also learnt about Thanksgiving, including why, when and how it is celebrated.

Since it is mostly celebrated in North America, Beech class was given the opportunity to discover the fauna, flora and climate of this continent, reviewing also the other six continents and locating them with the help of both the globe and the world puzzle.

Beech class had a lovely time elaborating a poster and learning a song about Thanksgiving. They also reflected on what they were grateful for, highlighting that they were grateful for their family, friends, houses or for having food to eat and clothes to wear. It was a wonderful interactive session that engaged all the children and was very enjoyable for all!

This week the children will be involved in activities which will be designed to learn a bit more about science .

Alongside working with our Montessori materials, it was a great week for us all. Some of the children enjoyed using the long rods with their teacher to try and form a maze. <u>Nursery</u>

Acorn and Seedlings class had a week filled with lots of fun activities and lessons. The children were really excited to learn the Snowman poem and we have recreated the poem on our display board. We first applied white paint on the board using the paint drip technique. The children enjoyed experimenting in applying paint in a different way. Then we drew and made our snowman, sticking cotton buds for his head and body. Throughout the week we created a rabbit, carrot and robin birds which we added to our display board. The children had an opportunity to be part of the whole process of creating a display board where we planned, took turns and shared resources to see the final result in the end. We also celebrated Thanksgiving, talking about the tradition of this holiday and sharing what we are thankful for. The children enjoyed a special snack menu and a party that followed after it. This week we are going to talk about Christmas, introduce poems and stories about Christmas and continue creating our Christmas decorations.
