
then

### **Teacher Information**



A very warm welcome to our new class teacher Miss Ozge who has joined our expanding team. We are pleased that she has been able to join us early and will be getting to know all the

children over the next few weeks.

Miss Ozge is a highly qualified and experienced teacher with a degree in childhood studies, Miss Ozge is a keen computer gamer and also enjoys playing badminton.

### **Class Information**

### **Prep Class**

Over the past week the children in Prep class have been focusing on selecting a 'just right' text, which they are able to read with confidence. We have discussed how they can decide on choosing an appropriate text that will enable them to further develop their reading proficiency skills. The children have also been learning some strategies to assist them to work out the tricky words in the text, like using the pictures and stretching out the sounds.

In literacy, prep class children have shared writing pieces about their weekends and experiences, as well as recounts of the books they read. To make our writing more interesting we used adjectives for describing the people involved and the setting. In mathematics prep class children have been introduced to the concepts of height, weight and length. Giving the fact that we had the caterpillars at school, the children had the opportunity to measure them every morning

with the ruler and see how much they would grow each day. In science we learnt about evergreen and deciduous trees, and the children got to name and draw a few of them.

### **Beech Class**

Before half term, children in Beech class had fun exploring Tanzania. We located this country on the map of Africa, learn about the meaning of the flag and created the flag, talked about animals you can see in the Serengeti National Park and which ones are the most dangerous of all. We also went on a safari trip in our garden, searching for the hidden animals and ticking them off the check list which was great fun. Children tried out some of the traditional garments and made a fruit salad using the most exotic fruit such as pineapple, passion fruit, mango, avocado, etc.

This week we will take a small break from travelling around the world and focus on something that is happening in our classroom - metamorphosis. We have been observing our caterpillars growing and we have found them hanging in their chrysalis. Children find this fascinating, so we are going to talk about this change more in depth. Children will learn what metamorphosis is and which animals go through this change. We will make a caterpillar snack, caterpillar paper chain, look at the life cycle of a butterfly and a frog using classified cards and make a butterfly symmetrical painting. Children will look at the body parts of the caterpillar/butterfly and learn a poem and a song about this metamorphosis.

### **Sycamore Class**

Welcome back to our last half term of this academic year. I hope you enjoyed the lovely weather during our half term break.

Before the break we focused on "The Very Hungry Caterpillar" story. We read the book and we looked at the life cycle of a butterfly. We also have caterpillars at upper school, so we were able to see their transformation at school. They have turned into butterflies already.

For Maths we made number sentences with the



food that the hungry caterpillar ate in the story. For science, we talked about the life cycle of a caterpillar,

their habitat and what they eat. We also created a tree for our caterpillars.

The country of the week was Poland. Thank you to John for showing us some money and train tickets from Poland.



This week we will be learning about Japan.

#### Oak Class

Before the half term break, Oak class continued with our continent exploration on Africa and the country of Tanzania.

As a group we took turns to identify different characteristics about the Tanzanian flag. We compared this to the British flag and we observed any similarities or differences between the two.

After our presentation with the teacher, we also took turns to recall prior knowledge and locate Africa on the puzzle map. We used our creative skills to produce our own flag from Tanzania.

Our exploration about Tanzania continued with us observing images of different wildlife animals including a waterbuck, buffalo, rhino and a leopard.

We used our communication and language skills to discuss the Serengeti National Park.

The week concluded with a lovely Safari role play activity where we used out binoculars to locate different animal pictures in the garden. We used our writing skills to tick the picture of the matching

animal on worksheets.
We also used our sense
of taste to sample
different exotic fruits.

#### **Nursery**

The last week before the term break, nursery children enjoyed a variety of fun activities. We learned a bit more about Bulgaria. We located it on the Europe puzzle map and Miss Genya shared some lovely cultural items from her home country


which we all loved exploring. We continued with a sorting and sticking activity with the transport vehicles. The nursery children also had group and individual presentations of the pink tower and the broad stairs. On the last day of the week, we talked about the



weather outside and the importance of hydration. We made lemonade, taking turns at squeezing the lemons and adding the rest of the ingredients like some sugar and mint leaves. The children loved making and tasting the lemonade.

This week we will have a focus on Africa. We will learn how to find it on the continental globe and learn about its culture, music, dance, and animals that live there through a variety of fun filled arts and crafts activities.
