Class Information Prep Class

Last week Prep class children have been busy reviewing the contents they have covered throughout the year. Some children of Sycamore class have joint us to practice our sounds with the help of our friend "Fred the Frog". For those who might not be familiar with this, Fred Frog is a fun character who can say and read words only in pure sounds. This beanie toy can be used flexibly when doing our phonics programme to help introduce children to letters, sounds and words in a fun, dynamic and fast-paced way. The children learn their sounds by teaching the frog, which they find very fun.

We have continued reading on a daily basis, as well as doing recalls of what we read. The children have been asked to focus on understanding and comprehension so as to be able to understand what they read.

We have also had the opportunity to do lots of maths this week. Prep class have improved their knowledge very much in this area of the Curriculum.

Last week, Prep Class made a picture frame using lollipop wood sticks. In order to have the frame standing, the children needed to follow a certain pattern. We used PVA glue and realised quickly that the glue needs quite some time to dry properly before being able to lift the frame.

During the Art session the children used paint to give their frames some vibrant colours. Then they drew little

Last week we had so much fun learning about "Little Red Riding Hood". We read it and talked about the characters of the story. We created a forest, using a wide variety of materials, such as tissue paper, toilet rolls, coloured card. We took turns to create it. Also, we created the main characters of the book. We used toilet rolls, fabric

and wool to create them. They looked wonderful! You are all great artists!





Also, we learned about Egypt. Miss Rajae told us all about mummies, pyramids and hieroglyphics. We even had the chance to write our names using the hieroglyph symbols. What a fun week! Arthur did his birthday walk too, bringing in lots of pictures for us to look at. Thank you Arthur! And thank you for bringing all the toilet rolls! We enjoyed very much using them for our activities



This week will be all about sports! Get ready to do lots of exercise every day and we will also celebrate our sports day at school on Wednesday. The country for this week will be Italy.

Beech Class

Last week, children in Beech class explored India. We greeted each other every morning with "Namaste". Children learned where India is on the map and made Indian flags using white and green rice (which we painted) and orange lentils. Through pictures, children learned very interesting facts about India. The one about monsoon season was very interesting. Children watched a short video of a Bollywood movie and had a

lesson on how to dance like a Bollywood actor. Miss Uzma from Willow class was very kind to give children a presentation about India and described the artifacts she brought from India. She showed us her wedding sari, a marble piece bought in Taj Mahal and a



small model of a Palki, where the Guru resides.

Children explored various spices and vegetables that are used in Indian cooking and had fun grinding some of them,



especially the garlic, so our school had a distinctive scent afterwards. Children enjoyed having a

mango for snack and the week was finished of with an Indian party in the garden led by Miss Florine who played Punjabi music and invited many children to try out the sari that she brought in.

This week we will travel far and visit Australia. As always, children will locate it on the puzzle map and make the flag. Through pictures and books children will learn the main features and characteristics of Australia such as the climate, the geography, people, food, etc. We will focus on learning about the history of the Aboriginal Australians and create aboriginal art. Children will learn about animals living in Australia and they will create a kangaroo craft learning its body parts. We will finish the week by constructing a three dimensional Sidney opera house.

Oak Class

Last week we all enjoyed learning some exciting facts about India. We explored the Montessori continent puzzle map where we identified that India is located in Asia.

There are approximately 1.2 billion people living in India. The capital of India is New Dehli and the largest city is Mumbai.

We also explored different currencies including the GBPound and we compared it with the Indian currency Rupee.

Oak class used their creative arts and design skills to produce some lovely craftwork including an Indian



flag, Mendhi designs alongside some rangoli art.

The children participated in a lovely music and movement activity where we listened and danced to Indian music.

We loved learning about different herbs and spices used for Indian cooking.



It was so much fun dressing up in traditional Indian clothing called sarees.

This week we will be exploring Australia and we have some exciting activities planned for the children.

Nursery

Last week the nursery children continued their learning of the continents by exploring North America. We started the week with a bang with the Volcano experiment, the children enjoyed watching the chemical reaction between vinegar and baking soda and took time to explore the different parts of the volcano.

The children then moved on to working with the classified cards, naming and matching the animals of North America.


This week we are looking forward to learning about Antarctica, we will have fun
