Oak class did a fantastic job clearing the leaves and sticks up in the garden. Such good team work!






#### **Uniform**

Igor Stravinsky (1882-1971). Born near St.
Petersburg, he learned the piano as a young boy.
Stravinsky moved to the USA during the Second
World War. He settled in Hollywood, where he
worked as a conductor and a teacher, while he
continued to compose music. He became so famous
in Hollywood that he was awarded a star on the Walk
of Fame.

feeling nervous or angry. The children enjoyed a yoga and breath control session where they were able to experience what we have been learning in science about the respiratory. The children saw how our stomach moves when we inhale and exhale, and they learnt some tips to relax such as counting to 10 while deep breathing.

The children also celebrated Valentine's Day. They made such beautiful cards with lots of hearts and glitter!

This week, we are going to speak about jobs and people who help us, starting with the Police!

### Kindergarten - Oak Class

Welcome back to Oak class after the half term. We hope you all had a relaxing break.

The last week of the half-term was very busy for Oak class. We looked at the celebration of the Queen's Platinum Jubilee and all visually recognised a photograph of the Queen. We made bookmarks to celebrate. We will be covering this important event in June when many celebrations will take place.
