



It also extended on from our learning in science, as we talked about the axis which connects the two tyres and how we could attach





it to the vehicle's bonnet yet still be able to turn it. Furthermore, the children named different shapes we used and multiplied 2 tyres on either side to make 4! The children really enjoyed this cross-curricular activity.



### **Butterflies**

We are very excited to say that the children will enjoy working with the

Butterfly Garden again this Summer. The children really loved watching the caterpillars turn into butterflies last year, providing them with a wonderful opportunity to learn all about the life cycle of a butterfly and how to care for and feed the caterpillars.

fire safety, what to do in the event of a fire, and what the job of a firefighter is. They will even get to try on a firefighter uniform!

#### Children's House

Last week, the children at Children's House became police officers. The topic of this term is "people who help us," so we started by learning about the police and the work they do for our communities. The children enjoyed finding out what objects had been lost in class by reading clues and earned their own police badge!

The children also enjoyed celebrating Mia's birthday with one of our WMS Birthday Walks. The children loved seeing Mia's photographs that she brought in to share with her friends and singing the 'earth goes round the sun' song! Happy birthday Mia.

Joining mathematics and science, we talked about geometric figures and the movement of wheels.





The children learned that when a geometric body has flat faces, like a

triangular prism, it cannot roll. But if its faces are curved, such as in a cylinder, it can! Afterwards, the

children made their own police cars in an Art/D.T. lesson, with functioning wheels that spin. This week, we will learn about firefighters and the children will even have the chance to meet one.

#### Kindergarten - Oak Class

A busy first week back after the half term for Oak class. We started our week by helping to clean up the garden after the storm of last weekend. Wonderful teamwork by the children in Oak class, who were able to clear the garden of the fallen sticks and leaves.

The children were introduced to the topic this half term, 'People who help us'. We have begun this topic by looking at the role of a police officer. The children all enjoyed dressing up and as a class we acted out a role play of 'Cops and Robbers'. We

that to get help from the police we should dial 999.
On Wednesday, we weaved our own police car.
Weaving gives opportunity for children to explore pattern whilst developing

concentration and fine motor skills. We copied our letter of the week 'p' and police.

A child can be seen here in our class caring for a plant in the environment. This is a lovely practical life activity where she is dusting the leaves with water and cotton wool.



This week, we will be looking at the role of a firefighter. We will have a special visit from a firefighter which I am sure the class will enjoy. They will be able to see and try on the fire fighter's uniform! Our letter of the week will be 'f' for fire.

### **Kindergarten - Elm Class**

Last week was a busy week full of energy for the

children in Elm class. The topic for this half term is 'People who help us' and we started talking about different occupations by playing a game called 'Knock



Knock, What's your job?' through which children could explore different roles and make masks for each role. We talked about the role of police officers and how they keep us safe. They loved playing a detective game where they played the role of a police officer who had to find missing materials from our classroom, being guided by some clues such as the first sound of the missing object. They had great fun making woven paper police cars and practice improving their fine motor skills.



Our 'out and about' session saw the children exploring the world of plants. We talked about the different parts of a plant and we made an experiment to observe

the growth of the plants' roots. We took 3 transparent jars, placed a tissue in each of them, then we put soil. We took 3 beans and placed them in between the glass and the tissue for a better view of the roots. We remembered that the plants need water and light, so we watered our beans and placed them in the classroom. We can't wait to observe the process!

This week, we will talk about firefighters and their role in the community.

### Nursery

All our nursery children and teachers were very happy to be back after the half-term break. Our topic for the coming weeks is "People

Who Help Us".

Last week we learned about dentists. During our lessons, we discussed the work of dentists and how they help us.



We discussed how many

teeth we have and the importance of brushing and flossing. The children had the opportunity to practice brushing teeth using a model mouth and toothbrush and learned to correctly floss the teeth using Duplo blocks and playdough. They also learned how our teeth are affected by food and enjoyed discussing and sharing with their friends which foods are good for our teeth and how we can keep our teeth healthy and strong by avoiding certain foods.

The children had fun with the craft activities making smiles and decorating their cups and toothbrush.

This week, we will find out about firefighters and how they help us. We will learn about the firefighter's uniforms and the equipment they use. We will also have a special visitor during the week!
