Children's House

Last week, the children in our Children's House were learning about the life cycle of a spider. We discussed how long it takes for a spider to grow and complete its life cycle, what they eat and how long they can live. We also learned the interesting fact that there are more than 50,000 different types of spiders!



The children were able to identify the different body parts of a spider. We practiced drawing them and writing about them in our books. We extended our learning into numeracy, matching the correct number of spiders to the number cards.



During our 'Out and About' session, the children enjoyed using natural items to make spiders, such as by collecting enough twigs for their 8 legs. We extended our discussions on this topic during our art lesson, where we used paper plates and threading wool to create our very own spiderwebs. The children discussed what spiders use

their webs for and how they make them.

We also discussed Father's Day and the children created cards for their parents. We hope you had a lovely weekend celebrating.

This week we will talk about the life cycle of a frog. It is also our Art Focus Week, and we will be experimenting with various natural items to create art. We will also be looking at the artists William Morris and Andy Goldsworthy.

Kindergarten - Oak Class

We enjoyed lots of lovely activities in Oak class last week. We celebrated Erin's birthday with one of our traditional WMS birthday walks. Happy Birthday Erin!



Our topic around the life cycle of a spider was enjoyed by the class. The

children were introduced to lots of new vocabulary such as 'egg sack' and 'spiderlings', two key phases of a spider's life cycle. We were able to sequence the life cycle and we all made our own web using our fine motor skills to wind the wool around the sticks.

The highlight of our week was our trip to Lloyd Park



where we enjoyed our pond dipping experience. Every child had their own turn to use the net at the pond, sweeping back and forth in the water to catch some pond minibeasts. We were then able to identify each amphibians using an information sheet and by using a magnifying glass we could look much closer at our beasts.

We continued our theme of spiders for our out and about session and took home our play dough spiders counting out the legs. We finished the week talking about Father's Day and our own daddies. We enjoyed making them a card which involved imprinting our foot. Happy Father's Day to you all.

This week we are looking at the life cycle of a frog, and will be creating our own pond for our out and about session. Letter of the week will be 'f'.

Kindergarten - Elm Class

Last week in Elm class we learned about the life cycle of a spider. The children were able to identify the stages in the life of a spider from the egg sack, eggs to spiderlings, young spiders and adult spiders and we compared each stage to the life cycles of other insects and bugs we have looked at this term. The children were also encouraged to identify different parts of the body of a spider, counting the legs and the eyes, and also learned some of the types of spiders that live in the UK, such as the giant house spider or Daddy long legs.

For our 'out and about' session we listened to meditation music and practiced yoga poses. The children were very keen to repeat the poses and listened to music while focusing their attention on their breath and the movement of their chests up and down. The children thoroughly enjoyed this activity, some asking to repeat the poses the following day at school. Through yoga practice the child becomes aware of sensations in their body and the rhythm of their breathing, as well as becoming curious about what is going on in their developing body and gaining inner awareness. It increases flexibility, balance, and power coordination, making the child calmer and more peaceful.



In addition, we created our own spiders using a toilet paper roll, black paint, and googly eyes and then we went on to speak about where they live and how they build their home, the web. We looked at different photos of spiderwebs and we had lots of fun making our own using thread which was passed

on from one to the other. We extended our learning with a sound game where we matched different objects starting with the letter 's'.

This week is our art week, and we look forward to making art using natural materials. Our letter of the week will be 'a'. We will also continue our life cycles topic with the life cycle of a frog!



Sycamore Class

Last week Sycamore Class were busy learning about spiders! Firstly, we focused on the life cycle of a spider. This has helped us develop an understanding of growth, decay, and changes over time. We also practiced our sounds "s" in spider.

Using classified cards, we looked at and identified the

body parts of a spider such as the head, eyes, fangs, legs, abdomen, and spinners. We also learned the different types of spiders and where they can be found.

We created a gigantic spider web during our morning circle and took turns to walk underneath and pretend

that we were spiders. This activity has helped us use our gross motor skills as well as hand-eye coordination when trying to simulate different spider movements. Extending our learning, we also created a smaller web to use during our work cycle by threading strings through a basket with holes then using our hands to navigate the spiders out of their web.



We made spider play dough to reinforce the body parts of the spider and talking about shapes, colours and pretending to crawl using our play dough spiders.

The children were enthusiastic about making their Father's Day activity. Penny said she will give her daddy the card and tell him "Happy Father's Day and I love you". To all our dads, we wish you a Happy Father's Day and hope you all enjoyed celebrating on Sunday.

This week we will be focusing on the lifecycle of a frog and our letter sound of the week is "f" in frog. It is also Art Week! We will kickstart the week with a visit from Ola's mummy and look at lots of ways of creating art using natural materials throughout the week. Don't forget to bring in your twigs, feathers, leaves and such to use!

Nursery - Acorn and Seedlings

It was another busy week in our nursery classes. The children enjoyed learning all about the life cycle of a spider. The children were able to identify the various body parts of a spider, and also learned how they carry their eggs. We recalled the body parts of the spider when we made our own out of play dough. We used pipe cleaners to give them their 8 legs.



During our 'Out and About' session, the children were able to observe some spiders in their natural environment. They were very careful not to break the delicate cobwebs.

In art lessons, the children made spiders using the stamping method, black paint, and a toilet paper roll.

We also enjoyed singing the 'Incy Wincy Spider' action song.

This week is Art Week. Art activities have been organised throughout the week, with a focus on using natural materials and where we may find art within nature. Our week will begin with an art workshop from Ola's mummy.

We will also continue our topic of life cycles with the life cycle of a frog. Our letter of the week will be 'f'.
