Children's House

Last week in the Children's House we learned about the life cycle of a flower. The children were able to discuss and learn about different types of flowers using classified cards. In art children printed leaves. They also used clay to replicate the shapes of leaves and some



children made beautiful flowers from the clay, too.

Over the last few weeks, the children were training for our exciting Sports Day event, working very hard to be the fastest ones! The children thoroughly enjoyed our trip to the Waltham Forest Feel Good Centre to get some extra practice in before the big day.

On Friday, we were so proud of the children demonstrating their coordination, strength and balance skills, and their beautiful teamwork to complete the relay races. Children enjoyed running themselves, but the highlight was really seeing the mums and dads' race! It was a very fun and exciting day for all of us!



This week we are going to be looking at the life cycle of a human.

Kindergarten - Oak Class

It was another busy week in Oak Class. Thank you to



Max for being our flower monitor. The sunflowers complimented our topic perfectly this week as we learnt about their life cycle. We were able to sequence the life cycle as well as having the fully grown plant in our classroom where we

were able to use our

senses in exploring its features. We learned that a sunflower



tracks the sun and the flowers in the centre of the head are called disk



flowers which mature into sunflower seeds. Thank you to Erin who kindly brought in a lovely book on sunflowers that we all enjoyed.

As a class, we have been reinforcing our knowledge of beginning sounds of words. Understanding the sounds in words is important for developing readers and writers. When a child understands that words are made up of sounds, they can transfer this knowledge to their reading and writing.

A very happy 4th birthday to Heidi who celebrated her birthday last weekend.

Our show and tell sessions have been excellent this term for building your child's confidence. The children have been very keen to talk to their class about the item that they have brought in, and it has been pleasing to see the class using descriptive words and full sentences.

Of course, our week ended with our Sports Day event. As you know it was a very hot day, but the class did so well working individually and as a team. The mummies and daddies also looked like they enjoyed it and it was great seeing so many of you take part.

Our last full week this week will see us learning about the human life cycle. We will talk about how we are all different individuals as well as talking about what we would like to be when we grow up. Always an interesting topic. Our letter of the week is 'h'.

Kindergarten - Elm Class

Another busy week for the Elm class has passed with lots of fun and lovely time spent together. Last week was all about flowers and their life cycle from tiny seeds to radicles, sprouts to young plants and then



finally the fully-grown plant. We examined each stage in the life cycle of a sunflower and we tried to remember how each stage is different from the previous one. We discussed what changes as the tiny plant goes through the cycle, and how at the end it gives life to new plants and so the cycle continues. We practiced identifying the stages and placing them in order. We also compared the stages in life of a sunflower with other life cycles of a rose and a daisy. We finished the day with a movement activity and listened to Piotr Ilich, Tchaikovsky, Waltz of the Flowers.

We continued the week looking into kind of flowers from perennials to biennials and annuals and we also learned about the parts of a flower and how they get

their colours. The children also enjoyed listening to a new song about flowers called '5 Spring Flowers'.

We finished the week with learning how to press flowers using the flower press and we all made a beautiful collage with them after drying.



On Friday we had our Sports Day event which the children have been practicing for lots across the term. It was great to see some excellent skills and teamwork as well as enjoying the sunny weather during our teddy bear's picnic.



This week we will talk about the human life cycle and the letter of the week will be 'h'.

Sycamore Class

In sycamore class, we have continued to work with the Montessori materials as well as learning about the lifecycle of a flower. We looked at a

flower, how it grows and its stages. We used the "Simon Says" touch your toes, elbows, eyebrows...etc to build body awareness in relation to the parts of a flower. We also learned about the

types of flowers as we looked at different pictures such as rose, daisy, bluebells etc.

Thank you to Elyas for being our flower monitor of the week. Elyas brought in some lovely sunflowers, and we used the opportunity to explore the bright yellow flowers. We found out during our exploration that sunflowers are useful plants with large flower heads/blooms. They are named for the way they



turn their blooms from east to west to follow the sun which means they stand tall and find the sun to grow.

Throughout last week, we continued to practice for our sports day and were very excited to have been able to demonstrate this on Friday at the Sports Day event. We thoroughly enjoyed the day and it ended with our lovely teddy bear's picnic.

This week, we will learn about the human lifecycle and our phonic sound of the week is 'h'

Nursery - Acorn and Seedlings

The nursery children had an exciting week of fun activities and learning adventures. We learned about the life cycle of a flower through picture presentations, discussions, and art activities. The children were eager to smell different types of flowers and choose their

favourite flower from the variety we had in the classroom and on the classified cards. We were identifying the parts of the flower and matching the



puzzle pieces with the classified cards.

Our much-loved garden was a frequent place of visit and the summer weather allowed us a lot of water and sand play, as well as practice of fun exercises for our sport day. Friday was a success, with every child participating so well and demonstrating great teamwork in each of their events.

This week we will look at the life cycle of a human through lots of interesting discussions, presentations, and art activities.
