Class Information: Children's House Brookscroft

The children in our Children's House are enjoying our topic of Transport this term. Last week, one activity available to the children was sorting vehicles according to their numbers of wheels. This reinforces the language used for different vehicles as well as quantities and numeral symbols.



The children continue being introduced to more materials in their environment. Here a child works with the Sensorial material of Tactile Tablets. pairing them using her isolated tactile sense. Another child continues their work

with Mathematical materials, finding the quantities of golden beads for two digit numbers.

In Art, the children enjoyed using different materials such as sponges and cotton wool to paint the sky, water, and land. They then each cut out different modes of transport such as a ship, car and helicopter, and arranged them according to where they would be found.



This week alongside our Montessori work

cycles we will be looking at different modes of air transportation on. Our phonetic sound of the week is 't'. Please continue to support your child's learning by looking for things beginning with this phonetic sound.

Children's House Elm

Last week, we focused on "How we get to school" looking at different means of transportation. The children enjoyed exploring various transport replicas such as bus, trains, cars, tractors, boat, air balloon, unicycle, vans etc. Using the Sandpaper numbers, we identified numbers 0 - 4, counted and matched the number of wheels on each transport.

During Literacy, we practiced identifying the phonetic sound 'a' and traced it on our sand tray and chalk board. Tracing and writing this letter help contribute to the development of our pincer grip as well as fine motor skills. The children also did great thinking as they were able to think of words beginning with 'a'. Beckett connected the letter sound 'a' to 'apple' whilst Lily said 'a' in 'axe'.

During our music session, the children were introduced to different musical instruments such as cymbals, tambourines, triangles, shakers, and drums. We explored with the instruments and learnt the song "Down by the Station".

This week we will be learning and exploring the air transport. Our learning will be supported by various pictures and air transport replicas for the children to identify. The different types of air travel we will be learning includes plane, helicopters, gliders, hot air balloons and rockets. We will also discuss how each type of air transport works. For example, the helicopter has rotator blades attached to a motor to allow it to fly. Our phonetic sound of the week is 't'. Please do reinforce this phonetic sound with your children at home daily. E.g. playing the I SPY game or simply saying I can hear 't' in 'tractor' etc. This can be practised at home or on the way to school.

Children's House Oak

Children in Childrens House Oak are all enjoying the new environment and continue to be presented with the Montessori activities. As a class we continue to focus on the practical life activities which includes pouring and transferring to develop coordination of movement, concentration, and independence. The class enjoyed their first Italian lesson of the term learning some favourite food words such as watermelon, ice-cream and pizza. Shapes have been incorporated into our learning this week especially the circle.

During our 'out and about' session we used the parachute to imagine it was a turning wheel. Children were able to follow instructions and hear new language to



turn the wheel 'clockwise' and 'anti-clockwise.' We continued our circle and wheel theme and baked our tyre biscuits. Children were invited to mix and roll out the dough before using a circular cutter and eventually decorating the biscuits to look like wheels.

This week our topic learning focus will be on air transport. We will identify different types of air travel including planes, helicopters, gliders hot air balloons and rockets. We will talk about their differences and how each type works for example the helicopter has



rotator blades attached to a motor. The phonetic sound of the week will be 't'. Please encourage your child at home to to make the phonetic sound and model words for them to practise.

Nursery - Acorn and Seedlings

We had a busy second week in WMS. All children are settling well and enjoying getting to know their teachers and friends.

Last week we learned about the history of transport. Children enjoyed looking at the pictures of transport from years ago and comparing them to what we see nowadays. We learned a new song about different vehicles and enjoyed lots of art activities like: painting using different sized car tyres. We also used our imagination and tried to create vehicles while using and identifying primary shapes.

Our phonetic sound of the week was "a". Some children traced the Sandpaper Letter for 'a' and we all recognised that the ambulance car begins with the sound "a".

Throughout the week children were given presentations of Practical Life activities, which aid a child's independence, coordination of movement and concentration. We also continue to have small Grace and Courtesy groups, where every child has an opportunity to learn a new skill or words to aid their social interactions, for example, how to roll a floor mat, walk in the classroom, or how to say 'excuse me'.

This week we will be learning about air transport. Our phonetic sound of the week is "t". Please feel free to help your child to understand phonetic sound and think of objects around us beginning with "t".
