Book of the Week

Children's House Brookscroft



We started last week with a special visit from Firefighter Russ who told us about his work and the equipment firefighters use. The children showed great enthusiasm during his visit and were able to try on parts of his uniform.

We continued on our topic "transport". We focused on engineering and design and discussed the work of people such as designers, engineers, machinists and other people who are involved in vehicle construction.

In numeracy, the children have been introduced to addition using the small number rods. This activity is a fun way to learn addition. With the number rods, children learn how to add



numbers visually in a hands-on and engaging way.

On Thursday, we all sat down for our Thanksgiving lunch. The children shared with their peers what they were thankful for. Some were thankful for their parents, some for unicorns and toys.

This week we will be doing some junk modelling. The children will share their ideas about how to design a vehicle and what materials they will need. Our letter sound for this week is "K".

Children's House Oak

Last week we had a Firefighter come in and talk to the children about what a Firefighter wears and his equipment. At circle time we spoke about what cars and other vehicles are made of and we then discussed junk modelling. The children loved making different types of transport out of the recycling. We celebrated Thanksgiving last week and on the days leading up to that, the children made their own placemats with coloured leaves and a drawing of a turkey. This week was also Road Safety week, and for our Out and About session, we role played different scenarios in the garden with our zebra crossing. Some of the children were the drivers, some children demonstrated crossing the road safely and some played as the traffic lights or lollypop person. The children are also doing really well with the Christmas Concert practice, and we encourage parents to join in at home with practicing.

This week, we will be re-visiting what we have been learning this term and going over the different types of transport we have been learning about. Our sound of the week this week is "k". We will continue to focus on our practical life and sensorial activities in the class. For our Out and About Session, we will be doing hide and seek transport. Children will have to find the different small world vehicles hidden around the garden, act out the sounds of the transport they have found and then bring it to the basket. After that we will do a polishing/cleaning activity with these vehicles. We are also going to continue practicing for our Christmas Concert.

Children's House Elm

Last week the children had a busy and exciting week. We learnt more about Transport, this time focusing on junk modelling where they got to use their imaginations to build different types of transport.

Thank you to all that provided us with lots of recycling materials the children were able to use this opportunity to further develop their creativity and were happy with their end product which has also increased the children's self-esteem. Emmy after building hers said "my aeroplane has wings made of plastic bottles", Aila on the other hand made a toilet seat using a yogurt pot inside her built-up train. She said the toilet is for the passengers to use. Sebastian put toilet rolls inside his built-up aeroplane model saying "this is the motor part of the engine." There was lots of input from all the children as they demonstrated great concentration building their vehicle.



We were excited to have been visited by firefighter Russ on Monday. We demonstrated our good listening skills as we listened to what his job was like. He showed us his fire helmet, gloves, torch, radio, fire suit, boots and even the fire engine. We were also able to try on his hat! We

learnt why the fire engine makes noises and why they have blue lights on. We also learnt what they carry in their tank and why. We increased our vocabulary with new words such as, hose and emergency. We were told how important all these gadgets were especially during a fire.

On Thursday, we celebrated Thanksgiving by sitting together at the table. We listened to a story about Thanksgiving and said what we were thankful for. We also decorated a placemat which we placed our plates and cups on when having out thanksgiving meal. Maisie worked with the Short Bead Stair, this activity aims to generally familiarise the child with the colours of the short bead stair. The child learns how to build the beads into a stair and recognises that each bead represents a number.

The children practised learning to identify phonic sound "o".

This week, we hope to continue learning more about transport, we will discuss the kid of transports around us and where it can be seen. We will also look at how we can safely move around where they're transport with an adult. In addition, we will explore 2D and 3D shapes and start making our Christmas crafts.

Nursery – Acorn and Seedlings

We had a very busy week. We were learning about engineering and designs. We talked about how the vehicles are made. We have learned that car have 10,000 parts and we were learning the names of some of them by using classified pictures. Children enjoyed learning in small groups or having individual lessons with their teacher.

There were art activities and junk modelling, where children created cars.

All children enjoyed their thanksgiving snack where we all sat together in our dining room. We had discussions in the classroom, learning about why people in America celebrate Thanksgiving. We looked at the globe of the continents of the world and told children a story about British people sailing on the boat for such a long time. They came to America, but they ran out of all of the food. Local people taught them how to grow their own fruit and vegetables and they started to have their own gardens where they grew sweet corn, carrots, potatoes and many more. It all ended with a big celebration where they were eating food they prepared. We talked about what we are thankful for. Most of the children were thankful for their families.



Our letter of the week was letter "c". We looked at objects around the classroom that began with c. Children practiced writing the letter using the sandpaper letters or sand tray. This week we will continue learning about different materials we can use to build a vehicle while using junk modelling materials. Please feel free to bring some to the school for us to use.
