FREE Christmas Rhyme Time sessions


Waltham Forest Libraries are hosting these special sessions. We are told that there will be a visit from Santa Claus and a chance for you to take a photo with him.




We Catch the Bus **By Katie Abey**

Children's House Brookscroft

Another busy week for the children! We continued to discuss our topic "transport". We shared and gathered ideas on how to build a new type of vehicle and the materials we would need.

In numeracy, the children have been working on the addition stripboard. This activity teaches the children the mathematical concept of adding numbers 1 to 9 more abstractly as it leads the child through all the combinations in addition.



the sound letter "K". Some children have also started to work on the CVC words using the moveable alphabet.

On Thursday, we had our out-and-about session and the children enjoyed hot chocolate and marshmallows in the garden.

This week, the children will be enjoying some crafts around the festive period, and we will also find out how Christmas is celebrated around the world. We will also



continue to rehearse for our concert that the children will proudly be performing for you on the 19th of December.

Children's House Oak

Last week in Children's house Oak, we were looking back over the term at what we have been learnt about transport. The children created their own trains out of paper squares and a train template and then wrote the letters of their name on the train. We also did some focused Grace and Courtesy lessons like how to blow our nose and how to speak in a group. The children have had some new Mark Making activities in the class which they have been really enjoying. These include activities like cutting on a line, name tracing and date stamping. For our Out and About session, the children enjoyed a fun game of 'Hide and Seek transport' where they had to find pictures of transport that were hidden around the garden and then we went through the different sounds of transport they found.

This week is our Christmas Craft week, we will be doing lots of focused arts and crafts activities based around Christmas as well as our usual work cycle. We are also excited for the upcoming festive craft day with our parents coming in. The children will continue to practice for their upcoming Christmas Concert. Please continue to practice these songs with your children at home.

Children's House Elm

This week has been exciting and enriching in every way.



Our out and about session was all about finding 2D and 3D shapes in our environment. The response was great as children were overjoyed to associate many 3D shaped objects

around them such as snail shell (cone), a wooden log and a toy sausage (cylinder) and many more. Indeed a fruitful and joyful learning experience.

Reinforcement of 3D shapes were carried out by using blindfolds, feeling the shape dimensions and associating them with their flat shape bases. Children were introduced to the olfactory senatorial scent bottles. They actively participated in smelling, guessing and pairing scents of vanilla, lemongrass, mint and lavender.

We worked in small groups to get familiar with new skills and reinforce our previous learnings on Grace and Courtesy. We covered many areas of learning such as arranging flowers, covering our mouths when we cough or sneeze, using tissues or bins, washing hands and even carrying work trays to our tables or floor mats, putting them away when we had completed the task.

We are taking pride by learning to identify our names from other names, sounding it out, tracing it with care and finally practice writing it independently.

Our sound of the week 'k' and other literacy skills were practiced through sand trays, free hand writings, work in the book, sand paper letters, phonic I spy games.

We continue enjoying lovely experiences this month as we learn about Christmas through many fun filled activities and crafts. We are practicing with all our hearts for the upcoming Christmas Concert!



Nursery – Acorn and Seedlings

Last week we continued learning about how vehicles are made, and children were able to name some parts of the car, aeroplane or train.

This week we also started preparing for our Christmas art activities and we learnt about why we celebrate Christmas. All the children are very excited to celebrate Christmas with their families.

We continued learning phonics. The sound of this week was sound "c" again as some of the children were not very familiar with it last week. We looked at objects beginning with "c" and we used sand paper letter to trace "c".

We were also learning the meaning of prepositional language such as *behind*, *under and over*. Our number of the week was number 2. We counted objects and paired them into two. Children used the sandpaper number 2. This helps children to understand how the number is formed.

We had lots of fun on our out and about session where we looked for different objects and compared them to 2D shapes. This activity went well, and all children enjoyed looking for different sticks, leaves and many more objects from the garden. We learned about a new shape called a hexagon.

Children are enjoyed using practical life activities where they are exercising their hand and eye coordination and extending their language.

This week we will be concentrating on Christmas and there are lots of art activities prepared throughout the week.

Our letter of the week will be letter "s". We will be looked nag at number three and matching objects to this number.



We break up for the Christmas Holidays on Tuesday 19th December at 12.30pm and school resumes on Thursday 4th January 2024
