Our lost property will be placed outside the school doors at Penrhyn this week. Please check if you have any lost items. Any items left at the end of the term will be donated to a local charity shop.


Concert Letters

We will also incorporate experiments around gravity and extend the children's learning to discuss how important it is to protect and care for our planet. Class Information:

Children's House Brookscroft

Last Monday we had our class trip to the library where the children had a lovely time listening to stories and sharing books.

Throughout the week we continued to work on our topic, minibeasts, and learn a little about how we can help bees such as putting some sugar water outside for them to drink, which resembles the sweet nectar they get from flowers.

We were very busy preparing for our summer concert. The children have been practising daily and we have made headbands to wear during the concert.



The children participated in an obstacle course on Wednesday as part of our sports week. This included balancing, jumping, climbing and throwing activities which encouraged the children to coordinate their gross motor movements. On Thursday afternoon the children enjoyed some relay races!

We also enjoyed having our new friends from Penrhyn come to visit on Tuesday for the whole day. They enjoyed a work cycle with us and had their first tennis lesson with Miss Hillary.



On Thursday morning, we had a cooking lesson where we learned to make flatbread. The children enjoyed measuring the ingredients and making the dough.

We look forward to seeing you on Friday 19th for our summer

concert and leaver's assembly which the children have been preparing for. Those who attend a Monday are also excited to have parents watch their ballet lesson in the afternoon. We have planned lots of craft and garden activities for a fun final week of school.

Children's House Elm

Our highlight last week was our Sports Day! The children patiently waited for their turn and participated in the beanbag race, water race, and egg and spoon race. These activities aim to engage the children in physical exercise, encouraging teamwork and coordination. Through these games, they also practise their gross motor skills, balance and develop concentration. The children enjoyed the games and cheering each

other on.

On Wednesday, part of the class embarked on a minibeast scavenger hunt in Lloyd Park. Using



our keen observation skills, we searched the area for various minibeasts. As we found each creature, we practised our fine motor skills by circling the pictures on our bug hunt sheet. "I found the snail and I will circle it here," said Solar, whilst observing her environment and circling the snail picture.

Furthermore, Miss Karen spotted a cracked egg and upon looking up at the tree, we noticed a bird's nest. Miss Karen used this opportunity to explain what the cracked egg signifies. The children learned that a bird must have hatched from the egg and this short lesson prompted us to understand more about the life cycle of birds, the concept of birth, and the care that parent birds provide for their young.

We observed various minibeasts such as caterpillars on leaves, butterflies, worms and woodlice. At the pond area, we saw different kinds of birds, including moorhens, pigeons, and mallards and observed how they swam in the pond.



After our scavenger hunt and snacks, we enjoyed a pleasant walk back to the school where we shared our experiences with friends and teachers. We have also continued our lessons on bees; we have learnt about their crucial role in our environment and how they produce honey. Additionally, we have been preparing

for our summer concert and we eagerly look forward to our parents joining us.

Children's House Oak

Last week, in Children's House Oak, we had a very exciting week as it was Sports Week! The children also enjoyed the lovely weather and played various games outside in the garden. The children practised their gross motor skills and focus, as they played games like balancing a beanbag on their head and getting to the end of the garden as quickly as possible. They also practised their critical thinking skills during the hoop and cone race, as they picked up their hoop and placed it on the corresponding-coloured cone, before racing to

the end of the garden. Our last game had the children throwing a beanbag into a hoop on the floor, practising their throwing skills.



On Thursday we had our second trip to Lloyd Park, which went beautifully. The children enjoyed being out in nature, observing wildlife. They were incredibly excited to be able to see various stages of the life cycle of a ladybird. They showed fantastic listening skills as they walked carefully down the road singing the summer concert songs as they went along. On Friday, we learned about the body parts of a bee, and to really support the children's learning we watched a very interesting video of a bee collecting pollen to make

"bee bread". We also played some more sports games, this time incorporating the Montessori "walking on a line" activity, as the children attempted to balance a beanbag on their head and walk on a line.



This week, we will be doing continued practice for our upcoming summer concert and lots of summer activities. We will also be reviewing all the minibeasts we have learnt about so far. It has been such a wonderful topic to discover and learn and the children have learnt so much, even the teachers have learnt some new things about all the different minibeasts! We wish everyone a lovely summer holiday and to the children who are leaving us, we wish you all the best in your new setting. We look forward to seeing the rest of the children in September.

Nursery - Acorn and Seedlings

We had a wonderful sports week last week, full of fun exercise and learning about how important it is to keep our bodies healthy. The children enjoyed an obstacle course in the garden where they refined their gross motor skills through running, jumping, throwing the ball and much more. This was also a great opportunity to interact as a group, taking turns and working as a team. The children did really well and followed instructions while completing different tasks. We also learned new yoga postures and breathing exercises.

On Friday we enjoyed playing parachute games in the garden which the children found lots of fun. We were also learning about our body and what happens when we exercise.

In the art area, the children had fun mixing black and white paint to discover how they can make a new colour: grey. We also continued discussing the life cycle of bee and how honey is made.

The children are using lots of practical life activities in the classroom, where they are continuing refining their fine motor skills and concentration.

This week is our last week of the term. We are very excited for our summer concert, to share with you what we have been learning throughout the term. There are lots of art and craft activities prepared for the children and we will have lots of fun discussing what we learned this term. We would like to wish you lovely summer and look forward to seeing you back in September.
