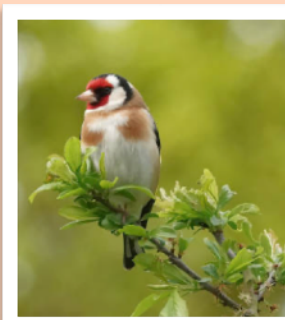
Our Parent Corner:

Why not [make a pair of binoculars](#) to look for the birds in your garden by using 2 toilet rolls, which can be decorated for added fun!



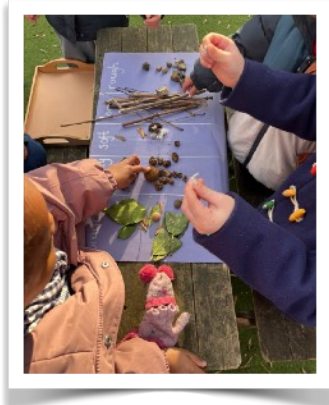
Last week at WMS.

The children enjoyed another week of weather activities. Group lessons focussed on the seasons in more detail, looking at the differences and similarities between them.

The youngest children continued to explore the new weather activities on the shelves. They worked with the sound of the week, 's for seasons'. Oak and Elm classes worked with many of the Montessori Sensorial activities, developing their fine motor skills and concentration and indirectly preparing for writing and further mathematical work. All the children at Penrhyn had a lovely music lesson at the end of the week, when they heard new percussion instruments, such as the triangle and the long wooden rainstick.

Brookcroft children had another exciting week. They enjoyed a scavenger hunt in the garden, looking for natural objects with different textures. They loved creating winter paintings with chalk pastels and printing with cotton buds. They were also introduced to embroidery and in maths, some of the children spent time working with the Montessori blue solids and matching them to flat shapes.
