The children had fun celebrating Chinese New Year; they had a noodle snack and read a story about a household getting ready for the celebrations.

The children at Penrhyn enjoyed exploring their Chinese New Year playdough and rice activities, as well as their noodle messy trays; Oak and Elm used chopsticks and scissors with theirs. Otis in Seedlings class brought in lots of decorations he puts up in his house on Chinese New Year, and came to school dressed up in traditional chinese clothes! The children created special artwork; some made pictures with red and yellow shapes and chinese blossom trees. It is the year of the snake and the older children made snakes by painting paper plates and printing red spots using bubble wrap, before turning them into coiled snakes. They all watched a dragon dance and tried on Chinese dragon costumes.
