


Easter Break.

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Last week at WMS.

Last week was a busy week full of celebrations! At Penrhyn, we started with St. Patrick's Day, creating leprechauns and shamrock art, while exploring the Montessori colour tablets in Seedlings Class. On Thursday, we celebrated Red Nose Day by wearing red and making biscuits and cakes for the cake sale. All the classes discussed kindness and helping each other, and Oak had a restful session in the garden, listening to all the lovely sounds. In our weather topic, we talked about clothes for different weather. Acorn class enjoyed 'I spy' and memory games with shapes. The older children made clay models inspired by Miró, using clay, twigs, and mung beans for decoration.

At Brookscroft, the children practised Irish dancing and decorated shamrocks. In Music, they learned the terms "allegro" and "adagio," whilst listening to pieces such as 'The Flight of the Bumblebee' and the music of Swan Lake. They also enjoyed Camille Saint-Saëns' Carnival of the Animals and attempted to guess each animal. The children especially loved pretending to swim like fish during 'Aquarium'. Finally, they began preparing the garden for sunflowers and wildflowers, digging the soil and planting flowers in pots for now.
