
Celebrating being unique.

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Last week at WMS.

We learned about rainbows, chatting about their colours and creating various experiments. The youngest children painted rainbow colours and matched them to the Montessori Colour Box 2 tablets. They also made clouds with rainbow colours for the weather boards in their classrooms. In Seedlings, Arthur's Dad came to read a book to the class, which they loved, and all the children gave him a group hug.

Elm Class used colourful markers, food colouring, milk and liquid soap to create rainbow effects. They explored a rainbow sand tray with coloured objects and markmaking tools. Oak Class used sponges and paints for their rainbow effects. During their Out and About session, they searched for rainbow-coloured items and created beautiful pictures with them.

At Brookscroft, the children coloured white flowers over several days by watering them with food colouring.

At WMS, our Montessori classrooms are beautiful and all our activities promote independence. The children have weekly Grace and Courtesy lessons and continue to prepare their own snacks and look after their classrooms with care.
