'Last Stop on Market Street' by Matt de la Peña. A lovely, beautifully illustrated book.

CJ starts his weekly bus ride across the city feeling disappointed and frustrated, wishing he and his family could drive a car like his friends do. But with warmth and wisdom, his nana shows him the joy and beauty hidden in their everyday journey.



The children enjoyed fun 'Out and About' sessions. The older children practised large body movements by pretending to be vehicles. The younger children created air, land, and water vehicles using natural materials. They also explored textures with cornflour and water in the sensory tray.

Throughout the week, the children learned about the history of aeroplanes. They learned about the Wright Brothers and made their own paper planes for classroom displays. They also counted and discussed aeroplane parts and their functions.

The daily Montessori work cycle continues, with the children growing very familiar with the routine and particularly enjoying Practical Life and sensorial exercises.

Oak Class baked flapjacks, and Elm Class made apple bites dipped in chocolate and sprinkles. Aryna was Seedlings' flower monitor. Our music lesson with Musicadoo was another huge success!

At Brookscroft, the children were inspired by the book of the week, creating detailed drawings. They also enjoyed sunny garden time with music, watering plants, and playful mud kitchen emergencies involving burnt cakes, 999 calls and fire engines!
