The older children extended this learning through role-play about being safe on roads and the Underground. In art, the children painted traffic lights & discussed colours and shapes. They enjoyed red, yellow, and green peppers for snack, after planting some and learning how to care for them.

As part of our land transport theme, we explored cars and trains; the children made pictures with car stamps. Using coloured pens attached to toy cars, they also made creative road-inspired artwork.

We continued Montessori Grace and Courtesy exercises. The youngest children loved joining in our weekly Musicadoo session, exploring instruments from around the world. Reuben and Zoe from Elm Class celebrated their birthdays with a special Birthday Walk.

The children at Brookcroft collected leaves on their trip to the park and then pressed them to make lovely pictures. They also used their beautiful wooden leaf cabinet insets to trace leaves for their summer display. The Thursday before half-term was our second Garden Visit Day for parents at Brookcroft, and it was another delightful morning.

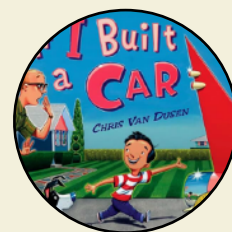
