


Walthamstow Montessori School

SPARE CLOTHES


Please put spare clothes in your child's bag in case of little accidents. If your child borrows clothing from us, please wash them and return them to us asap. Thank you!

All the classes continued working with the Montessori apparatus and exercises and had daily Grace and Courtesy lessons. Our sound of the week was ‘l’, and we focused on the number 7.
